PUBLIC CONSULTATION FOR GRAVES RELOCATIONS DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC AND ASSOCIATED RESTRICTIONS

The South African Heritage Resources Agency (SAHRA) permit regulations requires site notices and adequate public consultation prior to the issuing of a permit in terms of section 36 of the National Heritage Resources Act NO. 25 of 1999. In order to ensure that this process of consultation continues to be inclusive during COVID-19 pandemic restrictions where interested and affected parties may be prohibited from accessing or seeing notices installed on sites, SAHRA requires that the following measures be undertaken, and evidence thereof submitted as part of the application documentation.

1. Copy of the safety plans to ensure at all times the safety of those participating in the consultation during COVID-19 pandemic disaster.
2. Distribution of flyers detailing the intention to relocate graves amongst communities that are affected and interested in the proposed graves relocations.
3. Completed consent forms from families and the relevant community authorities.
4. Copies of attendance registers where consultations meetings were held within provisions of the relevant lockdown regulations.
